- Treat Others the Way You Want to Be Treated This is pretty self-explanatory
- Be Engaged Be on topic and involved in the discussion at the level of the student.
- **Be Prepared for Certain Uncomfortable Topics** Sex, Drugs, and Rock n Roll. In the Student Ministry, we talk about things that teenagers deal with. We aren't preparing students to be better high schoolers but to be better Christian adults, so we won't shy away from hard conversations.

And in the words of Barney Fife:

- Obey All Rules
- Do not write on the walls, as it takes a lot of work to erase writing off of walls

Of course, there is no way to enumerate all the possible behaviors that I expect from the students in the ministry. The main goal here is to maintain an atmosphere of maturity and respect so that all grades can be served appropriately. The Student Ministry is a privilege and a lot of the success lands on the ability of the students to connect in beneficial ways. While this is not school, and we try to be a break from school, if a student exhibits certain behaviors that would be unacceptable at school they would also be considered unacceptable here. Everyone is welcome, but we have to all be on the same page. If students can't achieve these expectations they may be asked to leave the student ministry for extended periods.
